Here's What We Are Studying

Unit 5 is called, Big Numbers, Estimation and Omputation. The unit starts out with reviews of Unitiplication & division basic and extended facts. Multiplication & division basic and extended facts Students will then review estimation strategies and Introduces exponential notation. The students will continue drill work in adding and subtracting numbers with decimals. They need to always keep in mind that decimals are lined up when always keep in mind that decimals are lined up with always and subtracting. If there are missing digits... fill in the place value with zeroes. Example: 35.6 (Add one 0 after the fact 44.25.

Math

Example: 402.7 (Add two 0s after the 7.) - <u>26.008</u>

Reader's Workshop

We used the article, "Perilous Voyage - From the Old World to the New World" to identify the main idea of paragraphs and supporting details. As we identified these elements while determining importance, the students were introduced to outlining.

We kicked off our new class book club, *Blood on the River.* No, it is not violent! The readers are excited about following the life of a boy who travels the ocean to the New World and his adventures during the settlement of Jamestown. Our reading goal is to read through Chapter 5 and the writing goal is to cite text clues that show this is a historical fiction.

Writer's Workshop

Focus: "Say What?" Boot Camp

This week writers will be looking more closely at the importance of dialogue tags. They will learn about sentences with introductory clauses/ phrases and how to punctuate this type of sentence.

Word Study - The Sort 6 Quiz will be given on Thursday. Time to study now!

Weekly Writing - As we complete the writing lessons on dialogue tags and sentences with "openers" and subordinating conjunctions, the students will then be expected to go back into their "Creepy" pieces and change/create this type of sentence work. In the meantime, writers should be rereading, revising, and editing their story to reflect what we are doing in class. This also means developing those areas that need more elaboration. The piece should still be a cliffhanger.

Social Studies

Our new unit is called, "Early Colonization." We are currently learning about The Lost Colony of Roanoke. The settlement of Jamestown will be our next focus. A study guide will be provided. The fourth grade team is now creating a revised curriculum for the remainder of the school year. Please be patient as we rewrite the study guides and assessments. The students will be wellprepared.
