Reader's Workshop

Writer's Workshop

New Focus: "Say What?" Boot Camp

Writers will be working on writing dialogue and dialogue tags correctly. We will continue adding to our repertoire of punctuation work in sentences too.

Weekly Writing - The students are writing a creepy or an adventurous cliffhanger about some kids who dare each other to enter an old, abandoned house. The story must include narrative and lots of dialogue. It cannot be violent.

This will be a "Before" piece writers uses as a vehicle to keep editing as our lessons provide more background in writing dialogue. Writers will also be expected to include all of the different types of sentences reflected in our lessons. We will further discuss this assignment on Monday.

This week, the goal is to write the introduction, rising action, and stop at the climax of the story.
