Here's What We Are Studying



Math

Unit 3: is called, Multiplication and Division, Number Sentences, and Algebra. The students will be focusing on the multiplication and division fact families. Understanding the importance of knowing these "turn around facts" When solving problems with missing numbers is essential.

We are trying to include Mad Minute basic fact check-ups 2 to 3 times a week. We started the year off with addition. Students should be in subtraction at this point. If your child is not, (Look at the papers in the Friday Folder.) then the weekly math goal should be to work on 1 or 2 of the fact families that slow him/her down. Using flash cards is the best method to improve automaticity. Only focus on the fact families that cause "clunks!"

Reader's Workshop

The next book club gathering is on Monday. There will be another meeting on Friday. Clubbers need to meet their reading and writing goals in advance of these dates.

We completed our class read aloud, Tiger Rising by Kate DiCamillo. We spent a lot of time talking about the symbolism and deeper meaning in the passages of this wonderful story about growing up, facing life's challenges, and in doing so, finding yourself.

Writer's Workshop

Focus: Personal Narrative

(Small Moment Writing)

Writers are in the final stretch of completing their stories. The students revisit their pieces each time we have a mini-lesson. Looking for and/or creating compound sentences that are punctuated correctly and stretching "telling" sentences to "showing" sentences were the focus last week. The writers are currently working on leads.

All pieces will be printed this work for peer and teacher conferencing. Final revisions and editing will follow. All stories must be turned in on Wednesday.

Word Study - The Sort 3 Quiz will be given on Thursday. Students need to be prepared to write about the "Noticings" and spell their PSWs correctly.

Weekly Writing - The stories should be read out loud this weekend to their grandparents to make sure the writing is authentic and well-developed. The grandparent's voice and personality should shine through their story. Elaboration is the key.



Social Studies

Our new unit, "Early Exploration," launched with a look at the Vikings. That was fun! Videos and interactive sites enriched the learning experience. Now the students are reading about Johannes Gutenberg and the impact of his printing press. The students will be learning how Marco Polo and Christopher Columbus influenced exploration.
